Online Safety Information for Parents

Our pupils are growing up in a world of ever-changing technology. While we feel that the use of technology can have a positive aspect of modern life, we cannot ignore the risks that can be associated.

Throughout the school we aim to teach our pupils:

- 1) About the impact of cyber-bullying and what to do if they have been affected.
- 2) To be vigilant when communicating online recognising that people may not always be who they say they are and to be sensible about what they share.
- 3) To tell an adult they trust if something happens online that causes concern or the child becoming worried or upset.
- 4) To question the reliability of information given through a web source.
- 5) To search responsibly for information using internet browsers.

We understand that much of our pupils' use of the internet will occur at home away from the school filters.
