

## Homework

- Encourage your child to present their homework neatly using a pencil.
- Children are expected to read regularly at home and this should be recorded 5 times a week in their reading record book. This is linked to our reading incentives in school where children can earn rewards for reading regularly.
- Spelling homework pupils will receive eight words each week.
- Homework tasks vary it may be a piece of writing, a maths problem or topic related. It will be manageable and focus on previous learning.

# Handwriting and presentation

We have high standards of handwriting and presentation in school. Reinforce high expectations at home when completing homework.

# Reading at Little Waltham

- In Elm class the children take part in daily reading lessons which last for 15 to 20 minutes. We have a simple text - The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark.
- These sessions focus on developing fluency, understanding of vocabulary and comprehension skills.
- Ways to support your child at home: share books, listen to your child read, ask them questions about the text and check they understand tricky or new words.
- Research tells us that children who read regularly have:

Their vocabulary is larger and more extensive.
 They perform better academically.
 Their imagination can run wild.
 Their creativity skills develop.
 They develop empathy.
 They gain a deeper understanding of their world.
 Their concentration levels improve.
 The parent and child bond improves.
 Their cognitive development is supported.
 Their social skills and interaction improve.



- Children can change their books regularly.
- Sharing books.
- Fluency texts and Big Cat fluency books are on the way.

- Later in the year we hope to visit the Wilderness Centre for a science trip.







## How to best support your child in Year 2

- Reading with your child daily and regularly questioning what has been read will make a huge difference.
- Number skills in Mathematics number bonds, learning times tables. Using websites such as TT Rockstars and Hit the button on the Topmarks website.
- Practise a range of spellings. This includes topic spellings and tricky words.
- Help your son / daughter research topics we are learning about in class.
   Watch a video on the GFOL or share a book about it.
