Multiplication Tables Check

In year 4, pupils will complete the multiplication tables check within the 2-week period from Tuesday 4th June 2024.

Games that will help with practising:



Multiplication Tables Check

This activity exactly mirrors the "Multiplication Tables Check' that will be given to children at the end of Year 4. They are tested on their multiplication tables up to 12 x 12. There are twenty-five questions and children have six seconds to answer each question and three seconds between questions. The questions are generated randomly using the same rules as the "Multiplication Tables Check (see below).

Results can be downloaded and printed at the end of the test.

Reading at Little Waltham


- Reading is a key life skill. Research tells us that children who read regularly:
- have a larger and more extensive vocabulary
- perform better academically
- are better able to use their imagination
- develop their creativity
- develop empathy.
- gain a deeper understanding of their world
- show improved concentration levels.
- can create stronger bonds with their parents
- show improved cognitive development
- can improve their social skills and interaction


Ways to support your child at home:

- Encourage regular reading of a range of text types
- Share books together to encourage a love of reading
- Discuss vocabulary encountered when reading

Reading in Year 4

We have our class text each term that we base our reading sessions around. We look at vocabulary, retrieval and inference skills, predictions, characters and plots.







We also have weekly sessions looking at a range of text types: non-fiction, poetry, picture books, songs etc. to become familiar with a range of language and text features.

Homework

- Homework will be given out each Friday and should be returned on a Wednesday.
- Children will receive 10 spellings each week that should be practised at home. We will also look at these each week in school and they will be tested on a Friday.

Handwriting and presentation

We have high standards of handwriting and presentation in school. Please reinforce high expectations at home when completing homework.

- We are looking to head out of school into the local area for some elements of our geography work.
- Later in the Autumn term we are planning an Egyptian workshop to take place in school.
- In the Spring Term, the children will go to the Year 4 Superstars sporting event.
- We will continue to look into lots of opportunities for the children to enhance their learning of our topics.
